

Counseling Services

Marital, family, parenting or personal counseling is available by Community Services Office in Redcliff. All intake is through Medicine Hat Family Services main office (403) 504-8026 where all calls are confidential. Services are designed to help individuals, couples and families. Services include: Counseling, Family Life Education, Therapy Groups, Self-Help Groups, Community Development. There has been a contractual agreement between the Town of Redcliff and Medicine Hat Family Services since 1988. If you need more information call the Community Services office or the Medicine Hat Family Services office.

Home Support Services

This program is offered to provide professional, quality and in-home services within our Community that promotes independence and is appropriate to individual family needs. Services are provided when assistance is required due to illness, convalescence, health limitations and other reasons. The cost is done on a sliding scale with the client's income. When the initial evaluation is performed the income evaluation is also included so the client is aware of their share of the service.

Meals On Wheels

To qualify for this program, applicants must fill out a form and meet one of the criteria outlined. ANYONE (meeting at least one of outlined criteria), regardless of age, is eligible for this service on a long or short term basis. YOU decide how often you need it. Forms can be filled out at the Community Services Department. The meals are hot and nutritionally well balanced. Lunches are delivered Monday - Friday between 11:15 - 11:45, except on holidays. If you would like a meal on the weekend one will be delivered to you on Friday. Payment for the meals are subsidized by the Redcliff Community Services Department. You will be charged for meals on a monthly basis. The bill is mailed to you and is paid at the Redcliff Town Office. Your cost for each meal is only \$5.50. Local volunteers from the community will deliver your meals. If you or someone you know, would like to volunteer as a driver, please notify the Community Services Office at (403) 548-7415.

Meeting Room Downstairs - Town Hall

The meeting room is available for public rental for education or instructional purposes. Seating capacity is approximately 50.

These included a shoe factory, glove factory, glass factory, steel rolling mill, foundries, brick plants, knitting factory, a truck manufacturing centre and a cigar maker. The foundations of some of the plants are still visible as a reminder of the era when Redcliff was the "Smokeless Pittsburgh of the West".
